ALUMNI IN THE NEWS



During his more than 27 years as a physician, Dr. Wiley T. Robinson has proven himself as not just a highly capable and highly trained physician, but as a medical leader within his community. Most recently, the Tennessee Medical Association (TMA)—the state's largest physician organization—selected Dr. Robinson to serve as president-elect for 2011 and, subsequently, as president of the association in 2012.

Dr. Robinson was chosen by popular vote in the TMA election by members of the organization, which include approximately two-thirds of the licensed physicians in the state of Tennessee. He will also serve on the TMA Board of Trustees, which is responsible for the implementation and direction of association activities between sessions of the House of Delegates, the association's governing body.

In addition to his new role as president, Dr. Robinson holds various leadership positions within the medical community. He is co-founder and president of Inpatient Physicians of the Mid-South in Memphis, Tennessee and serves as vice-chairman of the board of trustees for MetroCare physicians, a not-for-profit independent physicians association. Additional leadership includes the Health Choice Insurance, Quality Assurance Committee, Medical

Advisory Board of the Preventive Medicine Department at Methodist Hospital, Society of Hospital Medicine, and University of Tennessee College of Medicine in Memphis.

He credits his success, in part, to the University. "You gain a worldly experience at SGU and it contributes to your growth, making you a superior physician." Like many other alumni, Dr. Robinson was a bit hesitant about attending medical school in another country. However, he took a leap of faith and had the confidence and drive to succeed. "I had traveled, but the prospect of going abroad to get a medical education was a bit daunting," he admitted. "It was the first place I was accepted and it had the highest pass rates. I eventually overcame any question that I had about my own ability, and I realized I was more than capable." Upon graduating in 1984, Dr. Robinson went on to complete his residency in the United States and was selected Chief Resident at St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center in Paterson, NJ. The motivation that brought him to St. George's is the same that he has carried throughout his career.

Dr. Robinson exemplifies the type of health care professional St. George's University hopes to produce in the Schools of Medicine and Veterinary Medicine. The University is grateful for Dr. Robinson's contributions as an AAMP member and congratulate him on his TMA election.
