Grenada Remains Regional Leader in USMLE Performance

We are pleased to announce the results of a newly published study in the February 2011 journal of *Academic Medicine* that once again reinforces St. George's University as the leader in the Caribbean. Grenada's impressive 10-year average for Step 1 pass rate of 87.1% and Step 2 pass rate of 85% demonstrate the quality and success of SGU students and alumni.

Grenada's 10-year average for Step 1 is the highest of any country in the Caribbean and 31% higher than the average pass rate for the rest of the Caribbean. SGU graduates exceed the closest ranking country with private medical schools by approximately 10%. The USMLE Step 2 pass rates were also the highest of any country with private medical schools and the second highest of any country in the Caribbean, with Grenada .4% behind Barbados (which had less than 103 students take this examination in the entire 10-year span of the study).

"The recent study is only part of the puzzle.

We have been a leader in the Caribbean since 1982, when the first external study was published in *JAMA*," commented Dean of Enrolment Planning, Margaret Lambert. "The results of Grenada's USMLE scores are indicative of the quality of education available at St. George's."

Message From the Coordinator

In recent months St. George's has been making headlines. Chancellor Modica encouraged the NY State Board of Regents to review the standards of Caribbean schools approved to conduct clinical rotations in NY hospitals. "One of the issues facing St. George's is that all Caribbean schools tend to be lumped together, but all Caribbean schools are not equal. St. George's outshines all the other schools in any quantifiable performance outcome," stated Chancellor Modica. Recent USMLE scores, RCVS pass rates, as well as the success of our alumni only serve to reinforce this observation.

We continue to evolve and transform as a University, and some significant developments have already occurred. The School of Veterinary Medicine has received provisional approval for US government loans, the online MBA program has attracted some of our own alumni, and Uni-

versity Support Services has moved to our new location in Great River, NY. While some things have changed overtime, the view of the Caribbean and your memories from your time on the island are to treasure forever. Vet Students Eligible for US Federal Loans

School of Veterinary Medicine has been granted a provisional certification for Title IV Federal Funding from the US Department of Education. Qualified veterinary students will be eligible for federal student loans and in-school deferments. Over the past decade, SGU has trained more than 500 veterinarians who are practicing in countries around the world. It is listed with the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) and is currently in review for accreditation.

MPH Accreditated by the CEPH Through 2015

St. George's University Master of Public Health Program (MPH) is now accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health through 2015, one of five non-US MPH programs to be accredited by the CEPH. Dr. Vidushi Babber embodies St. George's University's motto to Think Beyond. In addition to practicing as a full-time physician in Washington DC, Dr. Babber extends her oath to serve her patients by aiming to help all those

in the heath care profession. Her non-profit organization, PRN Health Institute, provides training to physicians on how to use multiple forums to educate the public on health care issues. Dr. Babber recognizes the importance of facilitating clear understanding between doctors and their patients—especially in the age of advanced technology with constant communication. "Doctor's need to understand in today's world they have to get out of their office and take a more active approach in getting involved in their communities," she explains.

Dr. Babber is also founder of PRN Media Health, a network created to help physicians develop as speakers, consultants, and media personalities. It has recently partnered with the American Medical Women's Association to provide media training to its members. "Media training is a necessary aspect to deliver information in a way that is understandable." She points out that people are often getting the incorrect information from the Internet. Addition-

ally, today's doctors must face a variety of websites that rate their care. Dr. Babber teaches doctors how to monitor their online profiles and enhance their online reputation. "It can be quite scary to confront your ratings, but it is important to address."

Dr. Babber has hosted and produced 13 shows of Winning with Wellness: Where Beauty Meets Health on Voice America Internet Talk Radio; 24 episodes of PRN—a weekly television health show on Dish Network with a national primetime reach of 50 million; over 20 shows of Doctors Need To Know, CPR series, and The AMWA Hour on Blog Talk Radio; and she is currently in production of wPRN, a Women Physicians Radio Network. Most recently, she has had the honor of being selected to judge the Gracies, which award women in media. As a physician, Dr. Babber has co-authored A Healthier You, featuring Deepak Chopra and Billy Blanks, and Rising to the Top, with Les Brown, Patricia Ball and Jim Rohn. She was named one of America's Top Psychiatrists in 2007 and received the Patient's Choice Award in 2008 and 2009.
